

# Laycock Park Upgrades

July 2018

## Project update

Laycock Park has undergone many updates over the past year and will continue to see more improvements through the rest of 2018 and into 2019.

In 2017, Water Services resumed work on the Nose Creek Sanitary Sewer Trunk and storm infrastructure improvements that included a new oil-grit separator and repairs to the outfall.

This summer, Water Services will be building a new service road to reach the new oil-grit separator and repaired outfall.

Once the road is finished, Parks will begin re-paving the pathway through the park and constructing an accessible playground to compliment the one built in 2016.

At the same time, Transportation Infrastructure will be replacing the bridge that crosses Nose Creek. The old bridge was closed after the 2013 flood. The new bridge will have better alignment and be able to withstand a 1 in 100 year flood event.

## Upcoming

In 2019, we will complete construction on the Nose Creek Sanitary Sewer Trunk, repave the parking lot on the east side of Nose Creek, build a basketball court between the new bridge and parking lot, and start construction of the vanishing pond.

While we make every effort to provide accurate timelimes, it is important to note that the length of construction can be impacted by condition of the soil, the condition of existing utilities, unfavourable weather, availability of materials and difficulty and location of the excavation.


## Construction impacts

- Increased traffic along Blackthorne Road N.E. and possible parking restrictions.
- The pedestrian pathway will be closed and users will be detoured onto Blackthorne Road N.E.
- Sections of the park will be fenced off, but there will be plenty of off-leash area available and the baseball diamond will remain open.
- Noise and dust impacts will be monitored and will adhere to City bylaws.
- Work hours are typically Monday to Saturday, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with some days going as late as 9 p.m.
